

## Jason Brown

Windy Wellington is a wonderful place to be – if you are in a well-insulated home.



Jason Brown had bought a home in Wellington's Maungaraki. It occupied a lovely spot on a hill but was exposed to bitter Southerlies and Northerlies.

“The reason we went with foam was had pink batts and polystyrene, but it didn’t live up to our expectations. Wind was even blowing through the electrical sockets. We wanted something that was wind-tight, air-tight and had high R-Value.



“It was trial and error in the previous house that lead us to see what alternative products were available. It was hard to make the polystyrene underfloor insulation work; we noticed the air movement.”

In Jason’s new house the there was only a 200mm cavity in the roof to work with. He still wanted a high R-value and insulation, given the small space.

“I had looked at other rigid boards, and batts. The cost NZFoam was only slightly more upfront, but if you look at the shorter time it too to install - and I’m sure it will pay for itself in the long-run. We noticed changes in temperature, and air-tight instantly and haven’t had to have the heaters on yet.



“There was definitely noise reduction too. There were a couple of cold spells when a southerly came through, and you really noticed it when you walked from the old part of the house to the new part that had been sprayed out.



“The service from NZFoam was really great. We had a lot of questions and had to apply for change of consent for the insulation, but they helped us with the documentation for the council. Everything went smoothly.”
